Exploring Family Geography to Create Classroom Community

Aim: Students explore and reflect on the roots of their own culture and build a classroom environment that supports authenticity and community

Sequence of Activities

1. Warm up: In circle, say your name followed by a food your family enjoys together

2. Human Mapping:

- A. Using the center of the space as a starting place (CURRENT SCHOOL) move to where you currently live.
- B. Build a gesture and phrase that represents that neighborhood. Share amongst participants
- C. Using center of space as NYC (OR CURRENT LOCATION), move to where you were born.
- D. Build an individual gesture that represents that space.
- E. Using center as NY State (OR CURRENT STATE), move to where your grandparents were born
 - i. Connect with those around you.
 - ii. Share what you know about the area food, language, traditions, mythology, symbols, and important/significant animals.

3. Creating Symbols:

In same small groups of adjacent country/areas, participants agree on an area/location and one significant/important animal to represent that area.

4. Statement of Meaning:

Each group then crafts a "Statement of Meaning" that includes: What animal they are, where they are from, what makes them important/significant, what they mean to their community/culture

5. Share out:

Each group will get chart paper/poster board to illustrate or design their "Statement of Meaning." Posters can be hung around the classroom to represent cultural identity.
